House Testing for Canyon County ) Administrative Order  
Treatment Court Participants ) 2020 - 13

WHEREAS, in March 2020, the undersigned directed that all-in house drug testing of Canyon County treatment court participants be suspended, due to the public health emergency posed by the Novel Coronavirus of 2019 (COVID-19); and

WHEREAS, while COVID-19 public safety concerns still exist in Idaho and Canyon County, government restrictions on persons, businesses and activities in Idaho are being eased pursuant to a phased approach, as evidenced by the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare's Stay Healthy Order and the Governor's Idaho Rebounds Plan; and

WHEREAS it appears that in-house testing for Canyon County treatment court participants can be reinstated safely and in compliance with the Stay Healthy Order, Rebound Plan, and the Idaho Supreme Court's Order In Re: Emergency Reduction in Court Services and Limitation of Access to Court Facilities ("ISC Order"), dated April 22, 2020; and

WHEREAS reinstatement of in-house testing will promote the health, safety, and success of treatment court participants; it is,

ORDERED that the Canyon County treatment court in-house testing program is granted leave to resume in-house drug testing as of June 8, 2020, and it is further,


ORDERED that drug testing procedures shall comply with all requirements of the Stay Healthy Order, Rebound Plan, and ISC Order, including the following:

1. There shall be Personal Protective Equipment for all staff collecting samples, including face masks and gloves.
2. Test methods that do not require observed sample collection shall be used.
3. Workflow shall maintain six (6) feet of physical distance between staff and participants.
4. The testing facility and testing schedule shall be arranged so as to maintain six (6) feet of physical distance between participants waiting to be tested, both inside and outside the testing facility.
5. Collection areas shall be sanitized between each participant test.
6. Signage shall be posted advising that the following persons shall be prohibited from

entering the testing facility:

- a. A person who has been asked to self-isolate by any doctor, hospital, or health agency;
  - b. A person who is required to self-isolate because of travel outside of the State of Idaho;
  - c. A person who has been diagnosed with, and has not yet recovered from, COVID-19 or is experiencing any of the following signs or symptoms:
    - i. Fever;
    - ii. Cough;
    - iii. Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing;
    - iv. Chills
    - v. Repeated shaking with chills, muscle pain or headache; or
    - vi. New loss of taste or smell;
  - d. A person who is not wearing a mask that covers both nose and mouth.
7. Persons entering the testing facility shall be subject to a non-invasive temperature scan, if available.
8. Participants shall be provided with a contact number to call if they cannot enter the testing facility for any reason set forth in paragraph 6 above.
